

Global Compact Network: Annual Report México 2007

Mexico at a glance:

- The Global Compact was launched on June 2005.
- The National Network has nearly 400 members.
- Members include companies, from large to SMEs, academic institutions, civil society organizations and public entities.
- Four sub national administrations, that represent 10.6% of the GDP, participate in the GC.
- A GC guide for public entities has been designed.
- Services to participants include specific implementation tools according to their profile.

Organization

- The operative structure is based on the continuous support of the UN Resident Coordinator. A GC country coordinator serves as the focal point.

2008 Objectives:

- Consolidate the service platform (new and current participants) and facilitate UN-business partnerships.
- Develop collective actions that integrate the GC as an instrument for national development and competitiveness.

Network Challenges:

A major challenge has been to provide specific tools and training, based on the profile of participants and country context, for the internalization of the 10 principles and the CoP report. Two actions have been developed:

1. Learning and training sessions have been organized and scheduled throughout the year:
 - March-Workshop on Principles 7-9 (35 participants). The session included the participation of UNDP, UNEP and UNIDO as well as 3 examples of best practices on these principles.
 - June- Progress and value workshop (62 participants): with the support of the CG CoP manager and the Barcelona Center Support for the Global Compact, two training sessions have been offered, CoP are being delivered after the training.
 - August- CoP Q & A Session (26 participants), as a follow up to the Progress and Value Workshop.

- September- ISO 26000 (28 participants): with the support of the ISO Committee and Petrobras.
- September- Workshop on the 10th principle (60 participants): presented different tools that help participants to implement and measure their progress. The network has collaborated with the Federal Government in the publication of a manual on anti-corruption.

2. Training materials:

- Large Companies: in alliance with ITESM and CEMEX, a 96 hour-online course on CSR is available. The course dedicates one section to the GC.
- Public Administrations: in alliance with ICMA (International City Management Association) an implementation guide for local government has been developed and used by local administrations.
